Houston Chapter scholarships

The IADC Houston Chapter this year is awarding nearly twice as many scholarships to deserving petroleum engineering students than in previous years.

Twenty-six students at Texas Tech University, University of Texas at Austin and Texas A&M University will receive \$3,000 each from the Chapter this year.

"These students are the future of the petroleum industry, and it is up to today's leaders to encourage their studies," said Houston Chapter Chairman Darryl Smith of Atwood Oceanics.

"Unfortunately, the number of petroleum engineering programs offered at universities around the country is shrinking, and so are the number of students enrolling," Mr Smith said.

"We hope that our scholarships will encourage these students to continue their studies as petroleum engineers."

Mr Smith credited Dick Polk, New Tech Engineering, who, as Scholarship Chairman, has dedicated significant amounts of time to interviewing and assessing students and petroleum engineering programs.

Any junior or senior petroleum engineering major in a Texas college or university is eligible to apply for the scholarship.
